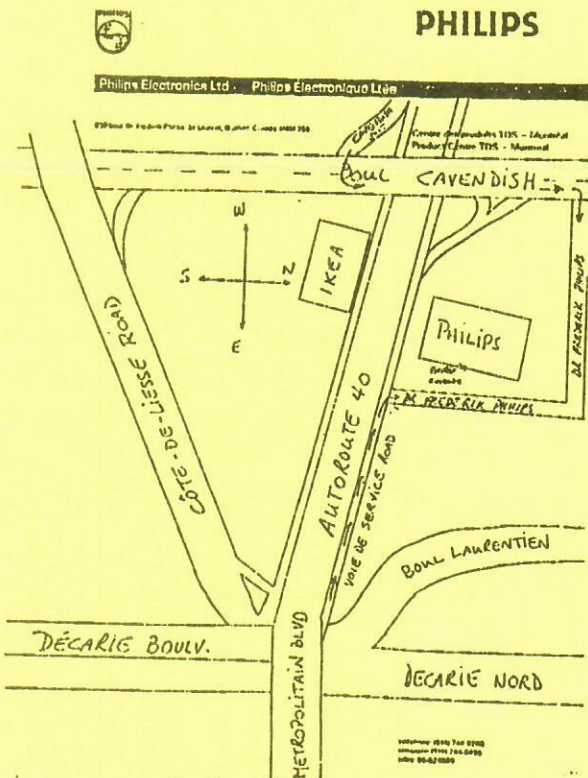

EDUCATION SUBCOMMITTEE

Concordia University continues to work with the section on Education in training. The program offers courses in Metrology, Quality Assurance Technology, Statistical Process Control, Quality Management and other quality disciplines. In the past enrollment for the program has been lower than desirable. We would like to see interest in the program increased. With quality being more important to industry, education in quality will continue to be important.

The program offered by Concordia leads to a certificate upon completion of the program. If a certificate is not of interest but improving knowledge in specific areas is what you require, individual courses can be taken. People who have completed the program are in a good position to write and pass the ASQC CQE examination.

During the next year an examination of the Quality Program at Concordia will take place. The content, level and presentation of materials will be examined. Options being considered are offering courses as part of the Continuing Education program and finding ways of reaching more students. The section will establish a training system for ASQC supplied teachers for the university.
