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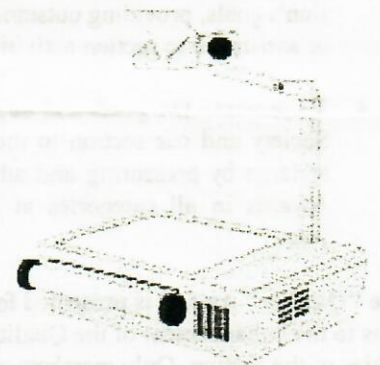
Courses

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Quality Awards 1998

Back in 1994, the Montreal Section created an Awards Committee to develop and propose a policy and a procedure for recognizing the commitment of members and non-members in our « quality community ». These documents were approved at a regular meeting of the ASQC Executive in Milwaukee. The objectives of these awards are :

- 1.1 To establish a means of giving recognition to the members of the Montreal Section who have demonstrated by their active participation, and their desire to enhance and advance the goals of the Society and our section.
- 1.2 To provide recognition to members and non-members of the Montreal Section furthering the advancement of the quality profession, the membership, industry and the public.
- 1.3 To recognize non-members or organizations demonstrating a willingness to aid the section in furthering the quality profession's goals, providing outstanding services or assistance to section activities.
- 1.4 To promote the goals and activities of the Society and our section to the community at large by presenting and advertising the Awards in all categories at least once a year.

The "Quality" Award is presented for outstanding contributions to the enhancement of the Quality profession, goals or activities of the section. Only members of the section are eligible for this award. The first Quality Award was given to Joseph Kelada, a well-known Montreal « teacher » and never-tired promoter of quality in 1996. This year, the Executive Committee decided to give recognition to two of its members at the Annual assembly.

On behalf of the Awards Committee, JP Amiel gave Dr David TOZER this year's first Quality Award. David (Mr Statistics

in our circle) is a Senior member since 1992 and over the past 12 years has served on the Executive Committee as Secretary, Vice-Chairman, Chairman and Education Chair, which he still holds today. He was also Deputy Regional Director for Eastern Canada for a number of years. He organized joint SMP training for the Executive Committees of both the Montreal region sections and Ottawa and has worked on the organizing committees of various Quality Conferences. He has also been volunteering on the side with Scouts Canada where he has been the District Commissioner for Pointe Claire for a few years.

The second Quality Award was offered to Jean-Pierre (JP) AMIEL by Dr Robert FAIRBAIRN, the Section Chair. JP has been involved with the Section for almost twenty years. His jovial approach to meetings has guided the Executive Committees through many moments. It also does not mean that he has not rolled up his sleeves as Secretary, Newsletter Editor, Vice-Chairman, Programs and Arrangements and even Director. He is also a Senior member and has worked on the organizing committees of various Quality events.

The "Education" Award is presented for significant contribution to the understanding and the promotion of the quality profession and its principles. Non-members are eligible for this award.

Raymond Dyer, the Section's Koalaty Kid Coordinator, presented this award to Allion School for its on-going commitment to the ASQ Koalaty Kid Program since 1989. The school was represented by its principal, **Frank Dottin, Annie Schaffhauser**, the Koalaty Kid Coordinator. Another committed member of that family, **Nellimay Tunteg** was absent at the ceremony. The KK Program fosters good work habits and positive attitudes on the part of the students, staff and volunteers, encourages enthusiasm, pride and a sense self-worth. It aims at building leadership and team work.

The recipients of the awards were also given a « Committed To Quality » lapel pin as a symbol of their dedication to quality.

The Executive Committee also has a number of dedicated individuals who have stayed on to help continue the Section's success. The Awards Committee Chair, JP AMIEL, personally thanked four past Chairs -- Charles (Chuck) ALTMAN ; Inteaz ALLI ; Sam WEISSFELNER and Robert FAIRBAIRN. Each received a « Committed To Quality » lapel pin.
